

## OLDA UI Wage Records Data Dictionary

<b>Column</b>	<b>Definition</b>	<b>Notes</b>
<b>KEY_ID</b>	Unique pseudo individual identifier across all administrative Ohio Workforce Data.	A study-specific pseudo ID name may be assigned in lieu of the key ID.
<b>YEAR</b>	Four-digit reporting or reference year of the data.	Calendar year
<b>QUARTER</b>	The calendar quarter for which the data are being reported.	Q1=JFM, Q2=AMJ, Q3=JAS, Q4=OND
<b>EMPLOYER</b>	A randomly generated identification number used in lieu of the identification number assigned by the State UI unit (the UI account number) to identify employers covered by the State UI laws. This field will be consistent from quarter to quarter to allow identification of the same unit over time, and also provides linkage across work force data sets. Numbered employers in the OLDA (e.g. Employer 1) are ordered by earnings per worker: Employer 1 paid R the most for the quarter.	
<b>WAGES</b>	The total amount paid to the Reference Worker during the entire reference quarter by a given employer.	<p>Rounded to nearest dollar. Prior to 1st Quarter 2009, wages above \$99,999 were top-coded to \$99,999 by ODJFS prior to transmission. In subsequent Quarters (1st Quarter 2009 and onward), the actual amounts were provided. Researchers should be aware that this may affect their analysis of the data.</p> <p>For all quarters beginning with the 1st Quarter 2009 and forward, the top one percent of wages have been top-coded to the mean of the values in the top one percent.</p>
<b>SUMWAGES</b>	The total amount paid to the Reference Worker during the entire reference quarter by all employers.	OLDA created variable

<b>WEEKS</b>	Weeks of work paid to the Reference Worker during the entire reference quarter by the Reference Employer.	
<b>MAXWEEKS</b>	The maximum weeks of work paid to the reference worker during reference quarter by any given employer.	OLDA created variable
<b>CTEMPS</b>	A count of the number of employers worked by the Reference Worker during the reference quarter.	OLDA created variable
<b>NAICS_3_DIGIT</b>	The industry (NAICS) code for a given employer, truncated to the first three digits of the code, to be used for identifying the primary economic activity in which an employer engages. The full six-digit NAICS may be available upon request.	OLDA created variable  The NAICS code of each employer is recorded as part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW). In the OLDA it has been joined to the UI Wage records (via the UI Account Number of the employer) as a convenience to researchers.
